

From the Director

I want to start by thanking all the Commanders, Directors, and Activity Chiefs for their great support and participation in this year's Armed Forces Week celebration. Without your efforts, this major undertaking would not have been accomplished. After 2 consecutive years of terrible weather, we had excellent weather all week until the night of the fireworks. Once again the weather was not the best, and we had to cancel our outstanding fireworks celebration for the first time in 14 years of this event. I do want to thank our Directorate staff and especially Ms. Amanda Tugwell, Ms. Deb Daubenhauser, Ms. Carole Kowta, and Ms. Amy Leon for their excellent efforts that started months in advance of the celebration.



Construction continues on numerous Community Service facilities. The second phase renovation of the Community Support Center (CSC) is on track. This is a \$3.6M MCA project that will construct the second floor and renovate the outside of Building 1520 similar to the Odom Physical Fitness Center and the Barquist Health Clinic. This will make our CSC the only one-stop facility in the Army that consolidates the majority of community and well-being support activities in one location to make it easier for our military, civilians, retirees, and their family members for inprocessing, outprocessing, and visiting community support activities. Hopefully, will be moving in September or October. Our final phase of construction will be to convert the existing Commissary area, when our new Commissary is built, into a new auditorium, additional training and education classrooms, a new Community Activities Center, and an 8-12 lane bowling center. Secondly, construction continues on our new Post Exchange that will include a gas station, Burger King, barber and beauty shops, cleaners, and numerous concessionaires. Construction is on track to be completed sometime in August with opening in late September weather permitting. Thirdly, construction should be ongoing on a new running track and our indoor pool at the Odom Physical Fitness Center. Construction should be completed in early Fall.

We should be in our final stages of the Project Validation Assessment (PVA) for our Hotel/Convention Center which will be submitted to the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Manpower and Reserve Affairs for approval to pursue the facility as a pilot test project under the Privatization of Army Lodging Program (PAL). More to come!

Our CY5 summer camp program is in full swing so be aware that we will have a lot of our children on post during the day participating in our outstanding programs. Plan to participate in our annual Fall Fest in September as we usher in the cool weather.



Please take time to look at our Well-Being Quarterly and highlight the upcoming activities and continue to market our programs to your family and friends so we can have maximum participation. As I have stated in the past, please continue to let us know how we are doing in our programs and services. Your input is very important to us. HOOAH!


Once again, thank you for your support and suggestions as we continue to make Fort Detrick a great place to work, live, and play.

Financial Readiness Program



ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF

Army Emergency Relief (AER) provides financial assistance to Soldiers, retirees, family members, surviving spouses, and orphans when there is a valid emergency. The office works with other relief agencies to assist all military personnel and their families.

Categories of authorized emergency financial assistance include: non-receipt of pay, theft of funds, medical expenses, funeral expenses, required travel, rent, utilities, food, repairs for privately-owned vehicles, clothing, privation, and fire or other disaster. For financial emergencies after duty hours, contact Armed Forces Emergency Services (AFES) Center at 1-877-272-7337.

HOUSEHOLD ITEMS EXCHANGE PROGRAM (HIEP)

The Army Community Service Household Items Exchange Program (HIEP) supports military families during challenging financial times in their life, mostly in the process of relocating to the costly Fort Detrick area. The program creates a network between people with items they want to donate, and military families that need those items. The HIEP staff matches needs with availability, and refers the applicants to the appropriate donors.



No storage is available, therefore donors are asked to hold the items until they can give them to the recipient. Participation in the HIEP is free. Applicants don't have to give something back to the program, unless they want to. Donations can be accepted from all sources, military and civilians. Priority on referral is given to junior enlisted applicants.



FOOD VOUCHER PROGRAM

Through the Food Voucher Program (FVP), we provide temporary emergency food assistance to needy military servicemembers, retirees, and family members. Usually this program benefits clients that, due to timing, nature of the case, and/or hardship in repayment, are not eligible for an Army Emergency Relief (AER) loan, or the loan cannot be processed in a timely manner

NOTE: Food vouchers can be spent at the Fort Detrick Commissary to purchase general food and sundry items.




